- Scissors

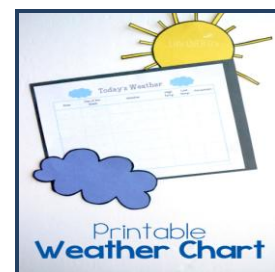
