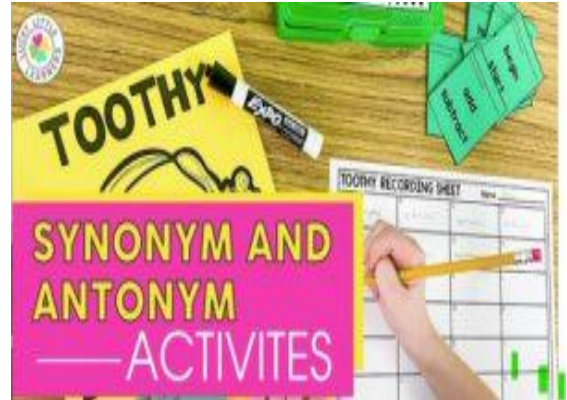


Activities for "Let's Compare: Healthy Analogies"

Synonyms and Antonyms Game

Working with synonyms and antonyms is a great way to help children build deeper meaning in what they read. Write a pair of antonyms, each on a sticky note. Give each student a sticky note to wear. Students must then find their antonym match. How fast can you find your antonym match? Mix up the sticky notes and play again. Create a class chart with the answers.
