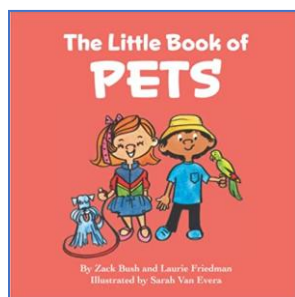
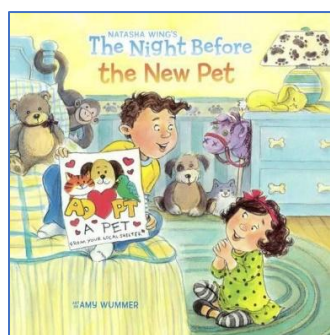

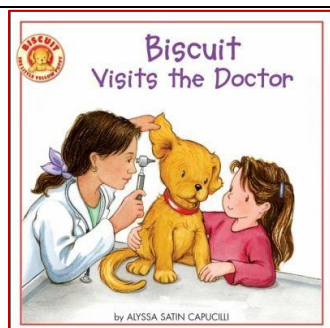
***The Little Book of Pets*, by Zack Bush, 2022**

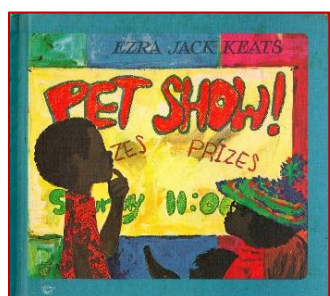
***The Night Before the New Pet*, by Natasha Wing, 2016**

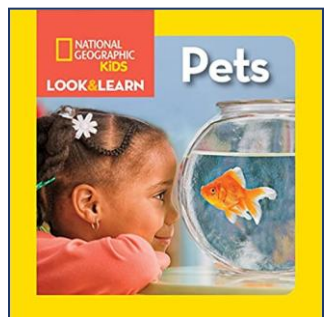
***Biscuit Visits the Doctor*, by Alyssa Satin Capucilli, 2008**
