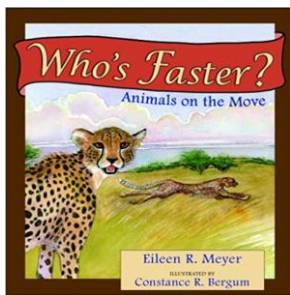


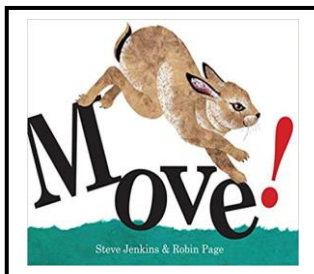

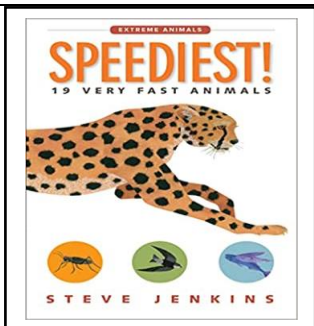
Who's Faster?: Animals on the Move, by Eileen Meyer, 2012

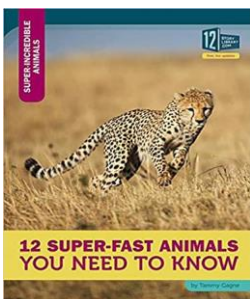
Move, by Robin Page and Steve Jenkins, 2011

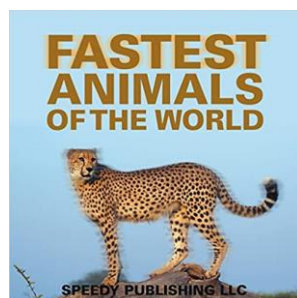
Speediest!: 19 Very Fast Animals (Extreme Animals), by Steve Jenkins, 2018
