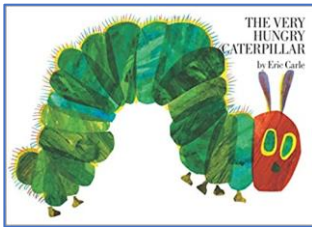
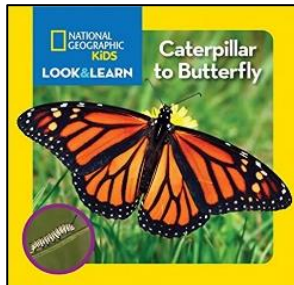


**Book Recommendations for “Clever Crawler”**



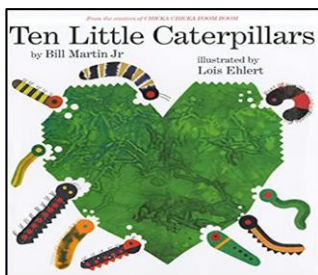
**The Very Hungry Caterpillar, by Eric Carle, 1994**

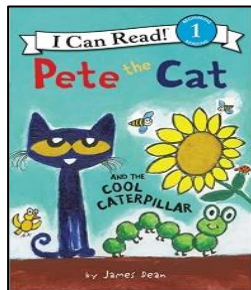
**National Geographic Kids Look and Learn: Caterpillar to Butterfly, 2016**

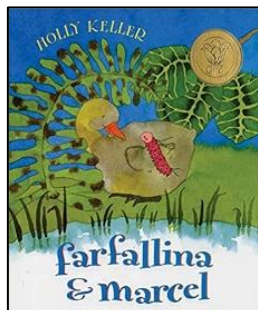
**Ten Little Caterpillars, by Bill Martin, Jr., 2011**
