Cartographers in ancient times made *maps* in simple ways. Maps of old were etched in stone or *tablets* made of clay.

Maps were drawn on goatskins or on fragile parchment scrolls. Clay balls wrapped with linen strips were used in making *globes*.

Today our maps are *digital* with *interactive* scenes. I can view maps on my *tablet*, on my *phone* or *laptop screen*.

Satellites send signals to receivers in my phone. My GPS provides live maps and navigates me home!
