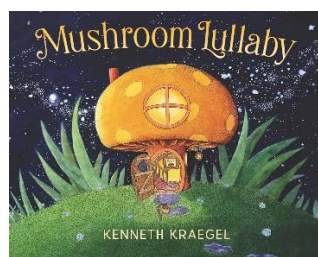
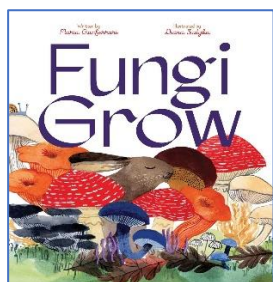


Recommended Books for “Mushroom Magic”



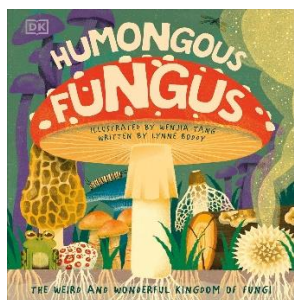
Mushroom Lullaby by Kenneth Kraegel

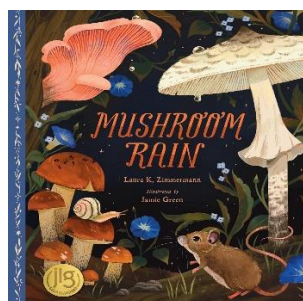
Fungi Grow by Maria Gianferrari

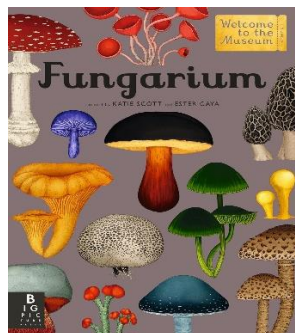
Humongous Fungus by Lynne Boddy
