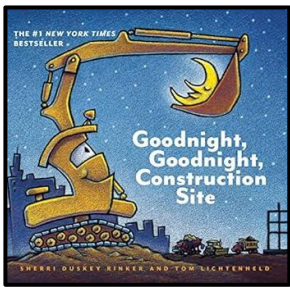
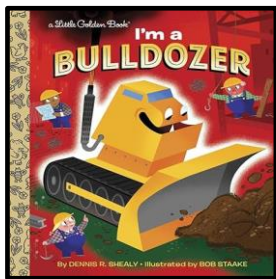


Recommended Reading for “Bulldozer”



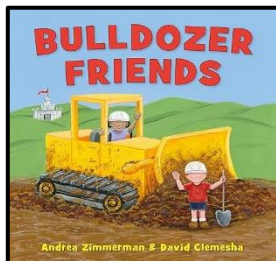
Goodnight, Goodnight, Construction Site! By Sherri Duskey Rinker

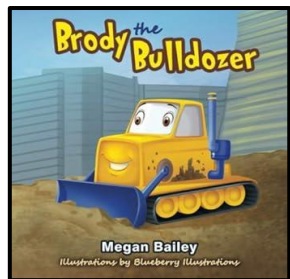
I’m a Bulldozer, by Little Golden Books

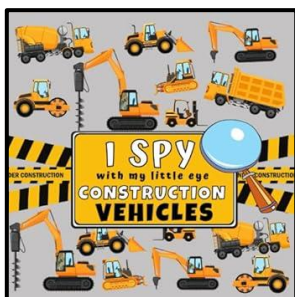
Bulldozer Friends (Digger Man, 4), by Andrea Zimmerman
